

Tree-mendous Team Work!

A 'day of action' was held at Wood Ley Primary School in Stowmarket, when local firm Timberwolf, and Stowmarket Town Council, joined forces to repair, and make safe, a woodland area adjacent to the Primary School - which had been vandalised earlier in the year.

Over 15 tonnes of timber were put through a shredder, producing wood chip which will now be used to resurface some of the footpaths at the school. The work will be completed during a second 'day of action' planned for Easter 2019.

Deputy Town Mayor, Councillor Paul Ekpenyong said: "My confidence in human nature has been restored through the actions of Timberwolf who have gladly stepped in to lend their staff and specialist equipment to this project. This is a really



good example of partnership working and demonstrates the great things that can happen when we all work together."

School headteacher, Sandra Renwick said: "We are truly grateful for the work that has been undertaken. The woodland area is really important to us and it is wonderful to see our children develop their confidence through the activities that they are able to undertake in this natural environment."

Museum receives grant of £158,610 towards Heritage Farm

The team at the Museum of East Anglian Life is delighted to announce that they have been awarded a grant of £158,610 from the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development and Defra towards their Heritage Farm project.

The grant will allow the museum to build a new attraction at the site, with new displays in a new building, an animal handling and learning area for visitors and better conditions for collections. New paths will make the site more accessible for all visitors.


The Heritage Farm will open in April 2019. As well as the new building at the heart of the attraction, there will be a brand new orchard and animals to meet, representing the key East Anglian breeds.



The museum's director, Jenny Cousins, said:

'We are delighted to have received this support. Together with a grant from Viridor and the money that the public have given, we will be able to create a new and exciting attraction at the museum. There will be hands-on activities available in all weathers and much better conditions for our collection. We're really excited about the project!'

The grant has been awarded by the Rural Payments Agency as part of its Rural Development Programme for England. The programme seeks to support the development of tourism and recreational infrastructure, to create jobs and growth in the rural economy.

Benefits and debt are most common issues faced by Stowmarket based charity

Local councillors, volunteers and members heard that problems with benefits and debt are the most common issues faced by people coming to Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk. At its Annual General Meeting the charity reported that in the last year it had addressed over 9,300 issues and helped more than 3,400 clients. The charity had seen a 6% increase in client numbers in 2017/2018.

Carol Eagles, Manager of Citizens
Advice Mid Suffolk, said that their
research had found that people
predominantly wanted face to face
advice, followed by phone then web
chat. The charity will trial a web chat
service as part of a new package of
support for Universal Credit claimants.

During the past year Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk has helped clients to claim more than £1 million worth of benefits that they were entitled to. The charity had managed £1.4 million of debt on behalf of its clients. The work done by the 50 volunteers had been officially valued at more than £390,000. Mrs Eagles appealed for more volunteers to help the charity deal with the increase in demand.

Michael Wangermann, Chair of Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk, said "We are a local charity and we rely on local support. My thanks go to our funders for providing the financial support that we need to be able to provide advice at no cost to our clients. We couldn't do it without our fantastic staff and volunteers and we are looking for more volunteers to join us."

Derrick Haley, Chair of Mid Suffolk

District Council, said "Although Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk have told us the statistics about the reach of their service today, this can't really measure the real positive impact they have on people's lives. The volunteers at Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk do an excellent job at advising people on how to solve their problems. If it wasn't for their work to help people, then the council would have to pick up the pieces."

Linda Baxter, Mayor of Stowmarket, said "In my professional life, I send people to Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk and they make a real difference. That's why I chose them as one of my Mayor's charities. We are fortunate in Stowmarket to have this excellent service."


Darts Update
